Metal Flashings — Including "Custom-Fit" Metal


Joints can leak, the metal itself can rust, or they can be improperly installed, causing leaks.

Flexible Wall Flashings

Can delaminate from the wall or slide off the wall (due to gravity), resulting in leaks and finger-pointing between the manufacturer and contractor.

Roof Penetrations (pitch pans, vents, drains, expansion joints, etc.)

Pitch pockets leak due to lack of maintenance; other roof penetrations can be improperly flashed, causing leaks.



Blisters In Membrane

Blisters form due to moisture vapor within the roofing assembly and can open (or be punctured by rooftop traffic), causing leaks.

Roof Insulation (under membrane)

Can cup, curl, shrink, or delaminate, resulting in membrane attachment problems and ultimately leaks (or even premature failure of the entire roofing system).
